**July 17:** Deadline for Team Challenge entries to receive resource materials.

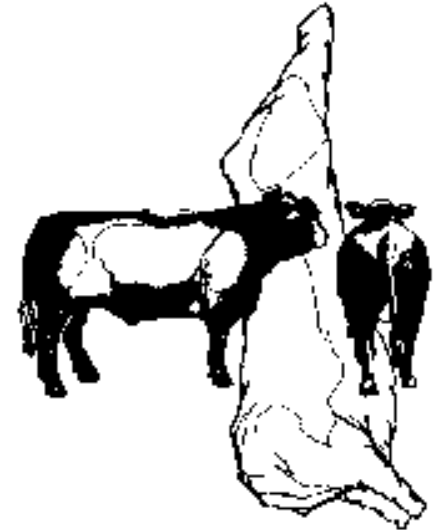
**July 21-24:** Final steer closeout weights.

# TCFA JUNIOR FED BEEF CHALLENGE

The objective of the Junior Fed Beef Challenge is to encourage young people to gain practical experience in feeding commercial beef cattle. This program stresses the importance of proper animal husbandry and financial management.

## INFORMATION

Steers may be validated any time between March 1 and April 1. Official entries must be submitted by April 15 and must include validation date and a \$35.00 per person entry fee.

For entry information and to obtain an Official Rule Book, 4-H, FFA leaders and feedyard managers should contact Trent Tyson at (806) 358-3681. Once the exact number of contestants and cattle are determined by the adult leader, contact TCFA to order contest ear tags (allow a minimum of one week lead time before validation).

After entries are received by TCFA, the adult leader and each contestant will be sent details for the written exam and oral interview/presentations.

Carcasses grading Average Choice will receive 2 extra points and those grading High Choice will receive 5 extra points and those grading Prime will receive 10 extra points (up to the maximum of 150 carcass points for the pen of three). A maximum of 15 extra points may be awarded for performance based on average daily gain and feed conversion.

## RECORD BOOK EXCELLENCE

Senior and/or Junior contestants who have a perfect score of 100% will divide a \$500 cash award.

## SENIOR DIVISION AWARDS

Scholarships will be awarded for the highest overall points in the Senior Division.

# TCFA TEAM CHALLENGE

The object of this contest is to encourage young people to learn about the commercial cattle feeding industry.

## CONTESTANTS

This contest is open to young people throughout Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico who are not feeding steers in the Junior Fed Beef Challenge. Only teams may be entered and will consist of two or three individuals.

The overall champion team will receive a **\$1,000 scholarship** to be split between team members. Plaques will be given to first, second and third place teams in both parts and in the overall average.

## CONTEST

The contest will consist of two parts: a **team presentation** and a **written exam** (both of equal point value).

The team presentation will test the team's knowledge of the cattle feeding industry and their presentation skills. Upon contest entry, all teams will receive the same industry related topic. On contest day, each team will give a 5 to 8 minute presentation on that topic. All team members must participate in the presentation.

The written exam will cover general information on the cattle feeding industry and allow participants to show an understanding of fundamental concepts such as calculations for closeouts and breakevens. Each team will collectively take the exam.

## ENTRIES

No entry fee is required for this contest. Entries for the Team Challenge must be received at TCFA by Friday, July 17 to allow time to send resource material. Additional teams, from preregistered clubs, schools or feedyards, will be accepted through July 29.
